I have dreamed of hosting the boys of Saint Thomas Choir School since I left New York for Chicago six years ago. Former Director of Admissions Victoria Vanasco and I made plans to bring the boys to St. James Cathedral in October of 2020, but like so many things, these plans were put on hold during the pandemic. At long last, our congregation was honored to host the boys on their first tour since 2019.

On Wednesday evening, the Choir School entourage arrived and made us their base of operations for the week. The boys rehearsed in the choir room, filling the cathedral buildings with the sound of their voices. The Saint Thomas habits and manners impressed everyone the boys encountered. Our receptionist told me the boys were polite and courteous, and one of our

piano teachers said she had never seen children leave behind such tidy stacks of music!

Rather than simply host the boys for a concert, Dr. Filsell, Ruth Cobb, and I designed a more immersive experience for all. We invited choristers from throughout the region to join the Cathedral Choristers for a Treble Festival. On Saturday morning, these choristers worked with Dr. Filsell to prepare Sunday Evensong. About an hour into rehearsal, the boys from Saint Thomas joined in, electrifying the participants. Most of these children had never heard other choristers sing with such poise and skill, inspiring them to sing with new fervor.


Saturday evening, Dr. Filsell and the boys performed an incredible concert, putting the full extent of their skills on display. I was impressed at how Dr. Filsell treated the boys as full collaborators in music-making. Quite often, he left the conductor's stand to accompany them at the piano, allowing the boys to direct themselves. The most memorable selections of the evening were the instrumental solos which the boys played with a remarkable level of musical sensitivity for children of their age.

As marvelous as the concert was, Sunday afternoon's Evensong was the true magic! The Treble Festival participants joined the boys and the ATB from our Cathedral Choir to sing works of Hurford, Byrd,

This experience has already paid dividends at St. James. Our choristers are singing with a new level of enthusiasm and seriousness. Whenever I need them to step up and sing more boldly or behave more professionally, I ask them to remember the boys of Saint Thomas. For a weekend, our choristers got a taste of what life could be like at the Choir School. I hope that some of the boys hunger for more, and that their families will call the admissions department in the months ahead. What a joy to see these two worlds come together to worship God and inspire each other!
