

We do, in fact, begin again. We have started the year with a renewed focus on community, learning from, with, and about each other. We'll make new friends and invite more talented boys to join our school as the year unfolds, and we hope that you, our closest friends and supporters, will find ways to reconnect either in New York City or at some other spot where the choir might be.


#### **Girl Chorister Course 2022**

The Saint Thomas Girl Chorister Course returned this summer after a two-year hiatus due to the pandemic. We were thrilled to welcome 29 girls aged 13 to 17, hailing from 12 different states and the District of Columbia, for nine days of music making, learning, and fun. Working with Guest Music Director Katherine Dienes-Williams as well as our own Organist and Director of Music Jeremy Filsell, the choristers sang five services—three weekday Evensongs and both the morning Eucharist and Evensong on the final Sunday of the course. It was especially exciting that the Gentlemen of the Choir were able to join the girl choristers for four of those services. The repertoire encompassed a wide range of periods and styles, with a particular emphasis on contemporary female composers including Cecilia McDowall, Judith Weir, and Caroline Shaw.

When not singing, the girls took classes in music theory, music history, and theology, as well as private voice and organ lessons. There was plenty of time for fun and relaxation too: on Tuesday evening we took a picnic dinner to the High Line, and

on Friday evening we took in a performance of the Broadway show *Come From Away*. Activities closer to home included yoga and zumba classes, movie night, and cookie decorating with our guest chefs Heidi Thomas and Bess Abraham.

Mr. Adach and Mr. Wentling worked together in music theory last spring, and Mr. Adach has done much this summer to augment the curriculum for all levels.

Our searches for an art teacher and athletic director continue, and we look forward to rounding out the faculty ranks with two more strong educators.



#### Alumni Notes

#### Frankie Halvey '20, Poet and Creator of "Pizzas in the Elevator"

The pizza poem came into being through the spirit of competition. Mr. Eppley, the art teacher at the time, loved to combine art and friendly competition. We did various things like the STCS annual Pinewood Derby, where each student would make a car, with two categories to win in, design or speed. Another thing Mr. Eppley did was called "Inktober" where every week in the month of October, students had the opportunity to submit a drawing that went along with a random word or theme he picked out of a hat each Monday. I also enjoyed doing that, and it helped me tap into my creative side and fulfill a boy's need to win. One year, we had a project where everyone created their own slice of pizza. Some people were wild and put different things on it, but I chose a simpler approach, decorating mine with pepperoni. At the end of the project, Mr. Eppley announced that the pizzas would be put in the elevator, but he also wanted something to go along with it. He held a competition for students to write a poem to go in the elevator. I decided to take a stab at it. For the next two weeks, I used my time before bed to attempt to write something poetic on pieces of notebook paper. I had never written a poem, but I tried my best and ended up winning. Whenever I visit the school, taking the "Pizza Elevator" always makes me smile and helps me reflect on my time at the school.




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#### Chorister for a Day and Open House

The Choir School welcomes boys and their parents who have an interest in visiting this unique school, instituted and sustained over the past century to educate the treble choristers of the Saint Thomas Choir of Men and Boys. The Open House will begin at 2 p.m. and continue until 3:30 p.m. when everyone is invited to attend Evensong at Saint Thomas Church, Fifth Avenue. Parents of our current choristers and faculty members will be available to serve as guides. Boys in grades 3-6 are invited to participate in the *Chorister-for-a-Day* program, and to experience rehearsing and singing Evensong alongside our current choristers. Prior music study is not

necessary, and any boy who simply enjoys singing is invited to attend. Visiting boys will join the choristers in walking to the church and then participating with them musically; experiences which will allow them a glimpse of a chorister's singing life. Registration is requested in order that music folders can be prepared for each participant.


